Anyone displaying COVID-19 symptoms will not be permitted to attend (staff or students).	Be vigilant and keep children at home if they are displaying COVID- 19 symptoms - High Temperature - New, continuous cough - Loss or change to your sense of smell or taste	Inform parents/carers if they feel unwell. Inform an adult at College straight away if they feel unwell.		
On arrival to College students' wellbeing will be monitored through checking of temperatures to minimise risk. This is in line with Trust secondary school recommendations.	A call will be made to parents if the College has any concerns in relation to any symptoms shown.			
If anyone becomes unwell with COVID-19 symptoms whilst at College, they will be removed to the COVID-19 Isolation Room. They will be advised to isolate for 7 days.	Arrange for prompt collection from College if contact is made.	Inform an adult at College if they feel unwell.
