Ivybridge Community College Transition Programme

We know that change can be daunting and the leap from primary school to secondary school is a big step. At lybridge Community College we are here to guide you and your child and support you to make sure the transition is as seamless as possible.

The last year of primary school is filled with opportunities to start the transition process. We run Open Mornings at the end of Year 5 and an Open Evening at the start of Year 6. We also run 1-1, small group tours and specific transition talks throughout the year. Once places have been allocated, a member of our transition team visits every single primary school to talk to staff and get to know as much as possible about each student as an individual. We run a Parent Information Evening in July where parents/carers and students meet their Tutor, followed by an Induction Day the same month so students spend a whole day with us meeting staff and other students. We also run enhanced visits for certain students recommended by primary schools to alleviate any anxieties about starting secondary school.

During the school year, we aim to run a variety of events where teachers go out into primary schools to run activity days and we also invite students in regularly to the College to experience extra-curricular opportunities. Over the summer we run enrichment opportunities which our new students are more than welcome to attend and we provide as much support as possible to ensure they can do so. It is of the utmost importance to us to create as many opportunities as we can for students to experience life

at lvybridge Community College before they join: relationships between the child, parents/carers and the College are fundamental.

We operate on a staggered return during the first day back in September so that Year 7 students feel confident before the other Year Groups join the College. All Tutor Groups are assigned a small group of carefully selected Year 10 mentors who have been well trained to ensure they help the students settle in as quickly as possible.

Each student is assigned a Tutor and each year group has a non-teaching Pastoral Leader and a College Director. We also have a range of other pastoral support available as well as our dedicated Inclusion Team. If parents/carers have questions or concerns we have a dedicated email address for each Year Group which means that we can reply to you promptly and do everything we can to support you to support your child.

Character Education at Ivybridge Community College

We are a College that strives for academic excellence, develops character and provides exceptional opportunities for all.

The choices an individual makes determines their future, and the purpose of developing good character is the ability to make good choices.

Character allows us to flourish as individuals, and as a wider society.

The College received the Association of Character Education Quality Mark in 2025 in recognition of its work as a school of character.

At Ivybridge Community College we demonstrate:

Respect by valuing others and our college environment

and by acting with responsibility.

Aspiration by aiming high in everything that we do.

Integrity by doing the right thing even when no one

is looking.

Compassion by seeking to understand the feelings of

others and by showing kindness.

The values of aspiration, integrity and compassion have been adopted from the Westcountry Schools Trust stakeholder survey values, and respect was added as a value the College found they were referring to repeatedly in a number of areas and policies.

Character education is embedded in the following areas:

Leadership and Management

All staff are role models of Character Virtues. All staff and students wear lanyards with the College values. All PowerPoints used have the College values at the bottom of the screen. These values are shared in every staff briefing and every event the College hosts. Character is caught through its prioritisation in College culture, language and role modelling.

Quality of Education

All teachers follow aspirational curriculums that strive for academic excellence. Assessments are coordinated centrally and moderated across Trust schools to support a rigorous feedback model that upholds integrity. Teachers have high aspirations for their students and prioritise the development of independent learning opportunities through an effort-driven approach. Aspirational students are celebrated through the **Star Student** award every lesson, Celebration Assemblies and the annual College Awards Evening.

Character education is **taught** across a number of subjects, but is explicitly focused on in PSHE lessons which all students receive once per fortnight within their Tutor Groups, delivered by their Tutors.

Behaviour and Attitudes

Respect is the key value that runs throughout the College's Behaviour Policy and strategy. The College's behaviour rooms (Reset and Reflection rooms) feature character displays and a restorative Behaviour Curriculum for the four values as well as for discriminatory incidents. A compassionate approach is supported through the collaborative approach of the Behaviour, Pastoral and SEND Teams.

The College uses the platform ClassCharts to recognise and celebrate students showing the character virtues with positive points and Star Student. There is a Personal Development award for students displaying the Personal Development value of the week in addition to the Star Student. These are celebrated weekly with all staff and students in briefings and assemblies and is a way in which character is caught and sought.

Personal Development

The College's Personal Development programme is aligned against the College's four core values, alongside a wider Tutor Programme that incorporates a weekly value that is focused on in assembly and Tutor time. This links with the PSHE programme which focuses on the four core values and British Values. Students also engage in a Literary Canon reading programme which features books that have been chosen because of their character education themes.

Character education is **sought** through student engagement in the numerous enrichment opportunities for all students, with over 200 clubs running throughout the year, numerous charity endeavours and a wide range of student leadership opportunities. All students participate in the lyybridge Charter in recognition of their enrichment engagement.

Excellence in Curriculum

Our Curriculum Vision

At Ivybridge Community College, it is our core purpose that all learners have access to a high quality, knowledge-rich, relevant, and challenging curriculum. Learners experience a broad and balanced curriculum that promotes intellectual curiosity and prepares them for the future.

Our aim is to deliver a coherent curriculum that inspires and builds on developing learners' knowledge and skills, helping them to become successful learners, confident individuals and responsible citizens.

The curriculum embraces creativity alongside a mix of more traditional subjects, blended with extensive extra-curricular enrichment opportunities, and places a high value on students' spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development; this is **The lvybridge Way**.

Curriculum Design

At lyybridge Community College, our Curriculum is a blend of three key components:

- Academic Subjects
- Personal Development
- Enrichment

Our academic curriculum is carefully designed and delivered by subject experts. For each subject, powerful knowledge is deliberately chosen and carefully sequenced at each stage to allow students to make connections and challenge and deepen their thinking and understanding.

At lyybridge Community College, we believe that alongside a rigorous academic curriculum, it is essential that students are provided with the opportunity to explore and develop as young learners, ready to embrace the ever changing world around them, and be encouraged to take part in a wealth of enriching experiences and activities whilst at the College.

Students will follow our PSHE programme, alongside Character Education, which supports academic studies by helping students to develop skills such as teamwork, communication and resilience which are crucial to navigating the challenges and opportunities of the modern world. Our PSHE programme also incorporates careers advice, guidance and information, development of Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural qualities and the Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) curriculum.

Throughout Years 7 to 11, students take part in Core Physical Education each week; the College fully embraces the notion of sport for all: for enjoyment and for physical and mental wellbeing.

Key Stage 3 Curriculum Overview

Ivybridge Community College works closely with its partner primary schools to ensure continuity and progression from the primary phase to the secondary phase.

Our curriculum in Key Stage 3 (Years 7 to 9) recognises the National Curriculum as a minimum entitlement. All students, regardless of their starting point, follow an ambitious and far reaching curriculum. Students will study the following subjects: English, Mathematics, History, Geography, Religious Education, Science, Technology, Modern Languages (French or Spanish), Art, Drama, Music, Physical Education, ICT and Computer Science, and PSHE.

Excellent Teaching

We provide a broad and balanced curriculum that is knowledge-rich, well sequenced and personalised. The latest research in cognitive science and education underpins our curriculum development and our learning strategy. Through its delivery in lessons, our carefully constructed curriculum challenges our students to become better thinkers, problem solvers and future learners who are intellectually curious and prepared for the future that awaits them so that fires are burning brightly for them when it is their turn.

Below are some core principles and techniques that teachers at lyybridge Community College are committed to.

In our lessons, you should expect to see:

100% disruption-free learning

At Ivybridge Community College, we are committed to ensuring that all students experience an education free from disruption and distraction.

Threshold

As students arrive at their lessons, teachers greet them at the door and welcome them into the classroom.

Silent starter

When students enter the classroom, the learning begins immediately. Teachers will clearly display questions for students to complete in silence, ensuring a purposeful and predictable start to lessons.

Common silencing strategy

When teachers require students to be silent they will say: "pens down, eyes on me, silence in 3-2-1." (This might vary slightly in a computer room or a practical lesson!)

Checks for understanding

When teachers explain new knowledge or show students how to perform new skills, they will check that students understand. Teachers might ask all students to participate using whiteboards; ask students to discuss their thoughts with a peer; or expect selected students to share their answers with the whole class.



Silent independent practice

After new knowledge and skills have been taught, students will be set tasks where they practise individually for extended periods so that teachers can provide effective feedback and students' learning becomes secure.

Live marking

When students are practising within lessons, teachers will circulate the classroom to ensure engagement with the task and evaluate student responses so that teaching can be adapted according to need. All students should receive timely and specific feedback, either live or deferred.

Literacy

At lybridge Community College we see reading as a gateway to the curriculum. In addition, our focus is to ensure all learners read more; read better and read for pleasure so that they can meet or exceed age-related expectations.

We have a mission to incorporate what is called Disciplinary Reading and Disciplinary Literacy in each and every subject. This involves teachers regularly reading to or with learners; encouraging extended writing using evidence-based writing strategies and employing Accountable Talk so that oracy and discussion follows a focus upon community, knowledge and reasoning.

We offer a clear diagnostic pathway for learners who require a tailored literacy catch-up curriculum to ensure that students who enter the College with low levels of literacy make rapid progress so they can access all and every curriculum area - even if that is a high challenge. Students are all tested on entry with a reading test which is nationally benchmarked, and which highlights the pathway they may take in their small-group intervention.

As part of the wider curriculum offer, we strongly encourage reading for pleasure and large numbers of students engage in multiple reading challenges and awards throughout the year. Our library is truly inspirational. As part of character education, all students read high quality and popular texts in our 25-minute morning Tutor time.

Learning Resource Centre

Research has shown that reading for pleasure can promote better health and wellbeing and at lybridge Community College we are incredibly lucky to have a fantastic space to facilitate reading in our on-site library which we call our LRC. Our library hosts over 17,000 books but also provides audio books, DVDs and

computers for students to use. The library is accessible to students between the hours of 8.40am and 5.00pm daily.

Our focus is to celebrate reading and we hold annual celebrations including World Book Day, the Carnegie shadowing programme, Read-a Thon and a Harry Potter day.

In addition to these celebrations we also offer:

- An all school reading challenge that sees students read up to 42 book titles, gaining praise points along the way and culminating in our annual pizza party in July.
- Author Visits Chris Bradford, Non Pratt and Tanya Landman have been our most recent guests.
- Weekly Reading Club available for all students across all Years.

Our love for our library shows in the fabulous decorations around us, from painted ceiling tiles, flying books, bunting and rainbow organised books. You can not help but fall in love with reading here at lvybridge Community College.

Reading underpins the entire curriculum.

We have pastoral systems in place for students who may need further support and our team will work closely with students and parents/carers to put in place suitable intervention if necessary.

Safeguarding

Please note that these routes are subject to change dependent upon demand.


