

Independent Learning in A Level Physical Education



After each lesson, in addition to completing any set work, a pro-active, independent learner would...

- Ensure that notes are completed and filed suitably in the folder relevant for that Unit.
- Read the relevant textbook chapter to embed knowledge and relevant content.
- Highlight any areas of concern and raise these with the teacher.
- Check the content of the lesson to diagnose lack of understanding.
- Recap and Revise key topic words on a regular basis throughout the course, to support knowledge.
- Ensure all practical evidence is being collated on a regular basis to demonstrate quality of performance in line with the specification.
- Be responsible for ensuring that practical evidence is stored in a format demonstrated in the relevant lesson.
- Use feedback in lessons, particularly related to exam questions ,and make notes on how to improve these in the future.
- Maintain a list of learning points from reviewed/marked work and regularly review this
 list
- Read the textbook chapter on the next topic before the next lesson.
