On this note, I would like to hand over to Ms Daniel, Head of Year 13, who is keen to share current developments specific to your Year Group.

Astonishingly, we are now 4 weeks into the Autumn term and time seems to be flying by very quickly. From experience Year 13 itself flashes by, (the Prom has already been booked!) so it is not too early for the students to be thinking about apprenticeship pathways or university course choices - this is a very important time for them as I am sure you already know. Students have been given instructions about how to start these processes, but if in doubt they should ask their Tutor for advice. We have a Mentoring Day on Friday, 4 November, when tutees will be able to meet with their Tutor on a one to one basis in order to gain guidance and support as necessary. A separate letter will follow on about this soon.

I would like to take the opportunity too, to remind you about Tutors' Evening for Year 13 on Thursday, 3 November - this is an excellent time to gather any information that you yourselves need as a parent about future choices. We are investigating the possibility of running two short sessions on the same evening dealing with apprenticeships/universities to make sure you are as well informed as possible.

A few reminders: we now ask that the students wear lanyards with their identity badges in College as part of our Safeguarding Policy. Students also need these to sign in and out electronically, a process which is essential in terms of health and safety and in any situation where we need to evacuate the building.

I am sure that you are already aware that independent learning in the Sixth Form is the key to fulfilling their academic potential: on average we recommend that A Level students should be putting in two to two and a half hours of work on top of their lesson time every day, and we would be grateful if you could encourage them in this.

Thank you for your continued support, and I look forward to Year 13 achieving their goals at the end of the year.
