



Extreme Heat Adjustments - Monday, 6 July 2026 to Wednesday, 22 July 2026

Option 1. Uniform with adjustment

- Formal grey College shorts may be worn as an alternative to trousers.
- Short-sleeved white College shirts are advisable.
- Blazers and ties may be left at home for the rest of the term.
- Lanyards are still expected to be worn.
- We recommend ankle socks instead of tights where appropriate.

Option 2. Physical Education Uniform

- College branded PE t-shirt (with lanyards).
- Navy blue skort.
- Navy blue shorts (these **must not** be Nike Pros or short 'hot pant' style shorts).

Sixth Form

- Sixth Form students should continue to follow the Sixth Form dress code.
- Students are expected to be positive role models for younger students.

Uniform Expectations

- Students must follow the uniform guidance above; if incorrect clothing is worn, alternative clothing may be provided and/or parents and carers contacted.

Parent and Carers Support, please ensure your child:

- Brings a refillable water bottle each day.
- Drinks regularly throughout the day.
- Brings a hat or cap for use outside.
- Applies sun cream before coming to College.
- Brings sun cream to reapply, if needed.
- Does not bring aerosol sun cream, as aerosols are not permitted.

Break Times and Outdoor Activities

Students will be encouraged to:

- Use shaded areas around the College site.
- Spend time in the dining areas and indoor communal spaces, where it is generally cooler.

PE Lessons

- PE lessons will continue.
- Indoor venues will be used where needed.
- Outdoor activities may be adapted to suit the conditions.
- Regular drinks breaks will be provided.
- Students must bring water bottles to PE lessons and will be able to refill them where required.

College Operations
