Year 7 Enrichment Week 2019

Ivybridge Community College will once again be hosting its very own Enrichment Week for Years 7 - 10 for 2019.

1. What is Enrichment Week?

While a large proportion of Ivybridge Community College students' time is spent on ensuring their academic success, we also believe in helping students develop their characters; find out more about their interests and passions; and invest in their social, moral and cultural life-skills.

The activities Ivybridge offers in Enrichment Week – including sports, arts, music, community development and Work Experience – are perfectly placed to support this. They can help improve Ivybridge Community College students' future employability, boost self-confidence, develop leadership skills, instil self-motivation, overcome fears and help them succeed in society. They are also a fantastic way to increase students' enjoyment of College life, creating an inclusive spirit and helping build life-long memories and friendships.

What happens?

During Enrichment Week the normal College timetable is collapsed and students are offered a range of alternative learning experiences and activities outside the usual curriculum. Activities across the year groups range from creative writing workshops, football sessions, cinema trips and caving to surfing, cheerleading, dance trips to London, and outdoor educational trips to the Ardeche.

3. Overview of the Week

Students will receive an Enrichment Week booklet, which includes the packages, activities and workshops available to them. Each year group will follow a different timetable. The packages, activities and workshops are either **on-site** or **off-site**.

On-site activities will take place at the College and within College hours. Some will involve a cost. Consent Forms are not required. Students can still access the College Dining Hall during break and lunch times. All Year 7 students are required to **register in the Sports Hall all week**.

Off-site activities and workshops take place outside of the College. There will be a cost for each activity to include entrance fee and transport. All parents must consent to off-site trips via ParentPay. All students will be required to bring a packed lunch and drinks (unless lunch is provided). Students must prepare themselves for all weather conditions (additional clothing, water proofs, sun cream, sun hats, and sun glasses).

Activities In Detail

Students will be participating in the following activities over the three days at BF Adventure:

- **Climbing** a safe experience where students can challenge themselves physically and mentally on a variety of climbing routes
- Rafted Canoeing students will learn the basics of paddling and the session includes games. All based in a purpose made on-site water filled quarry
- Team Building students will tackle a variety of problem solving puzzles in their small groups
- Adventure Quarry (Obstacle Course) Includes spiders web, shrinking islands, the wall, rope bridges, cargo net, plank crossing, raft crossing, gabions, duck island crossing and scramble net
- **Quarrysteering** Coasteering in the quarry! Challenge yourself to do more than you would have thought possible. Swimming and jumping required.
- Archery students will be taught by a qualified instructor to try to improve their target hitting skills.
- Giant Catapult Building students will work with their team mates to plan and create a catapult using
 poles and rope before competing against other teams
- **Evening Games and Sports** sports equipment will be available for each group at various points during their stay. Students will take part in a variety of games during their evening time
- Teambuilding Games and Sports Includes sports such as rounders and football.

Package 2 – Adventure

All students will undertake trips to Paignton Zoo and Dartmoor. Package 2 includes the provision of additional three-day trips with students returning home each evening.

Surfing – A day of surfing with Surf Up School, Polzeath. It is for all abilities but students must be confident swimmers. Students will spend the day at the beach and will receive two surfing lessons; one in the morning and one in the afternoon (10am and 1pm). You will also have the opportunity to take part in fun beach activities. You will be given a wetsuit and a surfboard to use.

Orienteering – Students will spend the day in Filham Park and Long Timber Woods. Students will learn map and navigation skills. They will use a map to navigate from point to point in diverse and unfamiliar terrain. Students will be given a prepared orienteering map, which they use to find control points.

Coasteering – Students will spend the day coasteering and beach activities at Anstey's Cove, Torquay. Students can jump from exhilarating heights. Explore deep sea caves, and squeeze through gaps to discover Devon's hidden gems. Reach Outdoors' guides will set the pace that suits your child's needs.

Package 3 – Team Building

All students will undertake trips to Paignton Zoo and Dartmoor. Package 3 includes the provision of a two-day camping and team building experience (non residential) and a one-day on-site activity participating in five different Physical Activities/Sports.

Physical Activity and Sport Day – All students will have the opportunity to try five different sports for the day. Students will join the PE Department and participate in a variety of sports trying something new.

Camping and Team Building – Students will spend one day on the College site learning the basics of camping and survival. Students will spend their second day on Dartmoor to experience camping. Please note this is a non-residential trip. Students will have the opportunity to camp, cook and survive the moors for a day.

- 1. Payment must be made using ParentPay. If you have not used it before, please go to www.parentpay.com and log in to activate your account and use the user name and password sent to you by the College.
- 2. All packages will go live on ParentPay from **Tuesday**, **16 April 2019** from 11am. Please note that due to restriction with the ParentPay set up and system it is **not** possible to release the activities and packages in the evening or overnight.
- 3. Select the preferred package (subject to availability) and make payment.

- 5. Once your payment has been processed you will be given a receipt number. Please put this on the reply slip (attached) so we know your payment has been processed.
- 6. Return the reply slip to your son/daughters Tutor by Monday, 3 June 2019.
- 7. All packages have a maximum number of spaces and are offered on a 'first come first served' basis. All packages are different with regards to the number of available spaces. If a package is full, students must choose an alternative activity.
- 8. Once ParentPay is completed and packages are signed up for, a register will be generated for staff. Students' details will be extracted from SIMS for offsite trips to include parent contact details, medical information, and allergies. The act of registering your son/daughter for a package on ParentPay, represents consent for your son/daughter to participate in that chosen package.
