


- The recently reformed curriculum has a much greater need for students to learn, recall and retrieve knowledge.
- The KITE booklet contains the basic knowledge they are expected to learn this year in each subject. Students will learn how to put this in context and how to apply it through lessons.
- During tutor time, students will be shown techniques to help them learn and remember this knowledge. Time will be devoted to creating revision resources and for lowstakes testing on the material during tutor time.
- So far we have explored cue cards and cumulative quizzing.

- The KITE booklets will also be used as part of the home learning in each subject and it is expected that students use their KITE booklets at home to self-quiz and to create flash cards and mind maps to help them remember this knowledge, use it in context and create connections.
- Please support your child in using their KITE booklet at home.

When you feel confident you have fully learned a card, remove it from the deck to focus on other cards. Return it in a few days just as you're beginning to forget it.

Home Learning

The purpose of Home Learning at Ivybridge Community College:

- To provide <u>opportunities</u> for students to <u>explore and develop</u> their subject passions and interests through home learning that supports and enhances the curriculum.
- To support student <u>endeavour</u> through establishing routine independent learning habits and use of <u>effective revision</u> strategies.
- To promote student <u>excellence</u> by developing subject specific <u>academic competencies</u> and <u>practical skills</u>.
- To enable outstanding <u>achievement</u> by supporting students to develop detailed <u>subject knowledge</u> and enhanced <u>academic literacy</u>.

Home Learning Strands

There are two strands of home learning at lyybridge Community College:

Subject Specific Home Learning:

Subject set tasks linked to the curriculum.

Guided Independent Home Learning:

Review of classwork and learning of core knowledge.

Students will be taught specific strategies to be used during guided independent learning time, linked to the learning and self-testing of core knowledge from the subject K.I.T.E booklets.




-Home Learning Programme Years 7 and 8

There are 2 strands of Home Learning at Ivybridge Community College:

- ~ Subject specific Home Learning
- ~ Guided Independent Learning

The College operates a two week timetable and consequently over this period, students should receive the following amount of Home Learning:






20 minutes subject specific and 20 minutes Independent Learning

Expectations for the completion of Home Learning:

Students should ensure that they take responsibility for the following:

- Recording Home Learning accurately in the Learning Journal
- Accessing E-Praise notifications from teachers about Home Learning
- · Making time to complete Home Learning
- Creating and following a Home Learning schedule to establish a weekly routine

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- Completing all Home Learning to a high standard within the time frame given
- Catching up with Home Learning if missed during absence
- Seeking additional guidance and support with Home Learning where necessary
- Adhering to sanctions issued if Home Larning is not completed without good reason

Home Learning: GCSE (Years 9,10 and 11)



Learning of core knowledge from your KITE booklets makes up some of your Guided Independent Learning time. Other Independent Learning tasks done in addition to KITE learning and subject specific Home Learning may include:

- Reviewing and improving classwork
- Acting on teacher feedback
- Carrying out wider research into a topic or subject
- Watching a documentary/ performance etc. linked to you subjects
- Producing and using your own revision materials
- Completing practice exam questions and past papers
- Practising and developing practical skills

The time guidance for Home Learning is the minimum expectation.

There will be times throughout the GCSE courses when students will be expected to complete more Home Learning in specific subjects in preparation for assignment deadlines, practical assessments and exams.

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- Recording Home Learning accurately in the Learning Journal
- Accessing E-Praise notifications from teachers about Home Learning
- Making time to complete Home Learning
- Creating and following a Home Learning schedule to establish a weekly routine
- Completing all Home Learning to a high standard within the time frame given
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- Adhering to sanctions issued if Home Larning is not completed without good reason

Recording Home Learning

Home Learning will be set by subject teachers in lessons and will also be communicated to students (and to parents) using epraise.

Students are expected to:

- Record basic information about home learning in their learning journal (student planner)
 -subject, summary of task, date set, date due in.
- Check epraise every day for Home Learning updates (using the planner or notification sections)
- Use epraise to reco been completed.

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Using epraise for Home Learning

Student's view

Students will have access to their own Planner by going to Me > Planner.


The diary layout makes it really easy for students to see when their homework has been set and when it is due in. If they have homework due within the next 5 days there will be a red circle to indicate this by the planner icon in the top right hand side of the screen.









The diary opens up showing the homework that is due, with options to look at 'Set only' or 'Due and Set' on the right hand side. There is also a handy key to indicate whether the homework has either been Set, Due, Overdue or Completed.



Students can click on the homework note to view the homework details and download any attachments by clicking the blue cloud icon. They can mark the homework as complete by clicking on the green Mark done button. This will update the homework in the diary view to show as Completed with a green icon.




If they accidentally mark homework as completed, they can quickly undo this by opening the homework and clicking the red Mark not done button.









Home Learning Rewards and Sanctions

Students will be issued with praise points for Home Learning in accordance with the college policy.

Where students produce exceptional quality Home Learning, either in of effort or outcome, this may be rewarded by college accolades.

Sanctions will be applied where students have failed to complete Home Learning on time or to an acceptable standard.


First failed Home Learning: Demerit

Second failed Home Learning: Subject Teacher Detention


Third failed Home Learning: Subject Department Detention
