This week you will revise 1.4 Making the Business Effective. You will receive an email with a course companion to read through and make revision aids from, or you can complete revision of the topic on SENECA and you will have a worksheet to complete and email to your teacher. You will have a week to do this. The work will also appear on epraise.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Economics</b></p> <p>In Economics you will have an email from Mr Stockley with revision to complete on Globalisation and a 6 mark question to submit via email to Mr Stockley. There will be a suggested structure given in the email to answer the perfect 6 mark question. Miss Shillabeer will also send you an email asking you to revise the Economic problem. This revision will help you prepare for a past paper which we will set later in the term.</p>
