Download Lesson 4 (Indonesia) booklet from epraise and fill this in following the instructions and QR codes to web links within the booklet. You can find the work booklet in Handouts under Year 8 closure work, it is also on epraise.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Drama</p> <p>YEAR 8 – THEATRE DESIGN PROJECT</p> <p>TASK 1 – RECAP LEARNING. Technical elements include stage layout, set design, lighting design, sound design, and costume, hair & make-up design. List 5 things that, in general, can be communicated to an audience through technical elements.</p> <p>TASK 2 – APPLY KNOWLEDGE. Using your own fable from Home Learning 3, or any other well-known fable, create a set design complete with lighting and/or sound design ideas. Present your design EITHER as a drawing on plain paper, OR as a cardboard 3D model. Choose one dramatic moment from your fable to show in action on your set design. Simply label your design to say what moment this is, and what lighting/sound design choices you have made. Photograph your finished design and upload this to Classworks.</p> <p>OPTIONAL TASK 3 – GET CREATIVE. Using your set design from Task 2, draw 3 (or more) different scenes to show how the technical elements will change to help tell the story. Draw actors on the stage (or use dolls/figurines) to show where they will stand, move, enter and exit. Label all drawings to show what you are intending to communicate to the audience, how you are doing it, and why you have made these choices.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">PE</p> <p>We will now be revisiting the Different PE challenges to see if you have made improvements following all of your Physical Activity. This week the focus will be Legs, Bums and Tums. Please continue to record any other activities you are taking part in and send photos in for us to share and see.
