By now, you should have enjoyed your second *Teams* Tutor meeting, and I hope that you are looking forward to seeing your Tutor and Tutor Group in person in the last week of the Summer Term per the schedule below.

As I said in my video on Monday, I need you to complete this <u>form</u> ASAP to indicate your preference for your *Futures Day*. There will be some common elements to the day, but to tailor to your needs, it will be necessary to split you into two groups for a portion of

the day: those interested in finding out more about applying to university and those who want to follow an alternative pathway (of which there are many!). Those belonging to the former group will have sessions delivered from university representatives and be given guidance on the application process, including the all-important personal statement. Those in the latter group will follow a more bespoke approach, with tailored support for your individual pathway, guidance on presenting yourself, both on paper through a CV and in the flesh through formal interview, and a mock interview experience with one of our governors later in the day. All students should receive time throughout the day to have a one-to-one discussion with their Tutor about their individual circumstances and aspirations.

Because of the restrictions on movement and rooming within the College under the current circumstances, it is critical that you identify which group you would like to be assigned to BEFORE the day. Unfortunately, we cannot accommodate students changing their choice throughout the day. If you are on the fence about applying to university, I advise that you join the university group for the day.

End-of-year reports

Just a quick reminder again that since we cannot currently admit visitors onto College site, regretfully, we will not be able to hold a Parents' Evening this academic year. However, your teachers are currently writing quite thorough subject reports that we use to form the basis of references for university applications and other requests made to the College. We will share these as part of an end-of-year report, alongside a message from your Tutor, so that you and your parents

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can receive some detailed feedback about your performance this year. Also, if we've been impressed with your effort this year, you'll receive an endeavour certificate – can't say fairer than that!

During these events, different guest universities deliver impartial sessions on important aspects of university guidance, alongside a moderated Q&A. Events are up to an hour in length and are hosted at


