The lvybridge Learning Strategy has Teach Like a Champion at its core and supports our vision for all of our students to receive an exceptional education and thrive in all that they do. They are centred around high expectations and levels of engagement from the very start of the lesson, regular knowledge retrieval and interleaving, checking understanding and extending student responses through questioning, as well as driving literacy and the use of academic language.

Year 7 Catch Up

These lessons are taught by subject specialists and are timetabled into the College day. eaching






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The lvybridge Way The Self-testing Toolkit Revision – what does work


The Testing Effect - when students test themselves, rather than just read, it builds their long-term memory.

Spaced learning – it is important for students to revise topics every few weeks, to ensure they keep revisiting their learning from a long time ago. **Desirable difficulty** – students will benefit from stretching themselves to answer in whole paragraphs, rather than single word answers.


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

The Tutor is the first point of contact for children's welfare and contact with their parents.


During Tutor time, students complete an enrichment programme that focuses on Personal Development.

Tutors will ensure that students are 'Ready to Learn' on a daily basis.


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
