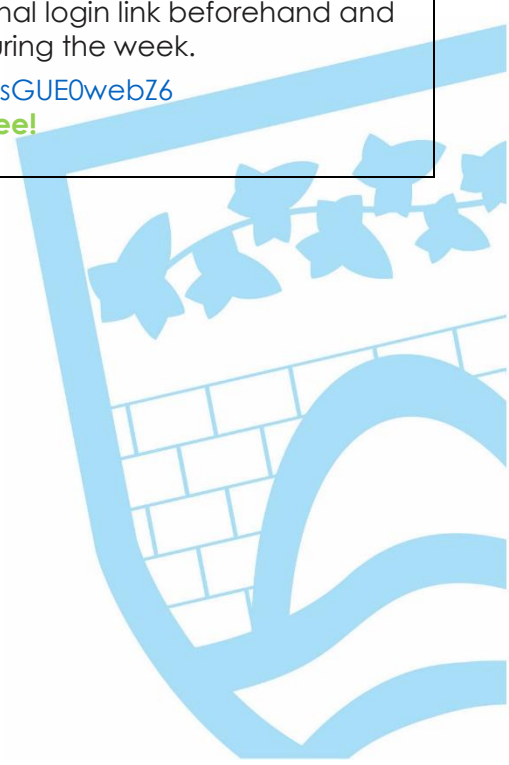

<b>OFF-SITE ACTIVITIES</b>			
<b>Option 1 Splashdown</b>	9.10am – 3.10pm <b>Meet on AW1</b>	Spend the day at a waterpark! You are allowed to wear muffi clothing to this event, but please remember your swimwear and towel. Please bring change for the lockers and a change of clothes for afterwards. Students will be travelling by coach or minibus to the venue. Bring sun cream in case it is sunny, you will also require your own packed lunch and drinks. Please meet on AW1 at the far end of the pitch and sit in groups. Follow the signs.	<b>£15</b>
<b>Option 2 Paignton Zoo</b>	9.10am – 3.10pm <b>Meet on AW1</b>	Visiting the zoo is an excellent opportunity for the students to apply knowledge and skills gained in lessons to an interesting and stimulating environment. Please wear sensible clothing for the zoo and appropriate for the weather. Students will be travelling by coach or minibus to the venue. Bring sun cream just in case it is sunny. In addition you will require your own packed lunch and drinks. Please meet on AW1 at the far end of the pitch and sit in groups. Follow the signs.	<b>£15</b>
<b>Option 3 Paintballing</b> Stoke Woods, Exeter	9.10am – 3.10pm <b>Meet on AW1</b>	Spend the day Paintballing in Stoke Woods! Paintball is a competitive team-shooting sport in which players eliminate opponents from play by hitting them with spherical dye-filled gelatin capsules ("paintballs") that break upon impact. Paintballs are usually shot using a low-energy air weapon called a paintball marker. Set in attractive woodland, the Paintball Centre's varied game scenarios enable students to experience all types of exhilarating warfare situations. Whilst you are out and about in our game zones, doing your best not to get eliminated. The cost of the trip includes the games, transport and 300 paintballs. Please bring with you an additional £9 for extra balls. Please dress appropriately for a game of paintballing. Bring additional clothing such as old footwear with you. Trainers will be required. Safety clothing will be provided. All students will require a packed lunch and drinks. Students will be travelling by coach or minibus to the venue. Bring sun cream just in case it is sunny. In addition you will require your own packed lunch and drinks. Please meet on AW1 at the far end of the pitch and sit in groups. Follow the signs.	<b>£32</b>
<b>Option 4 Dartmoor Walk and Picnic</b>	9.10am – 3.10pm <b>Meet Outside the Outdoor Education Room</b>	Students have the opportunity to walk along the moors. Students are required to meet outside the Outdoor Education Room (under the Gymnasium). They will need a packed lunch and drink. Students are required to wear sensible outdoor clothing/footwear, bring an extra layer and a waterproof jacket and bring sun lotion. Students should also have a rucksack to carry their items of clothing and food.	<b>£0</b>
<b>Option 5 Crealy Adventure Park</b>	9.10am – 3.10pm <b>Meet on AW1</b>	A day at Crealy Adventure Park. Please wear leisure-type clothing and trainers, adequate for running, log flumes and rides. Please bring a bag with a small towel. You might want to pack a waterproof jacket depending on weather conditions. Pack the sun cream too! Please bring a packed lunch and a drink. You will be responsible for your own bag and money. Students will be travelling by coach or minibus to the venue. Please meet on AW1 at the far end of the pitch and sit in groups. 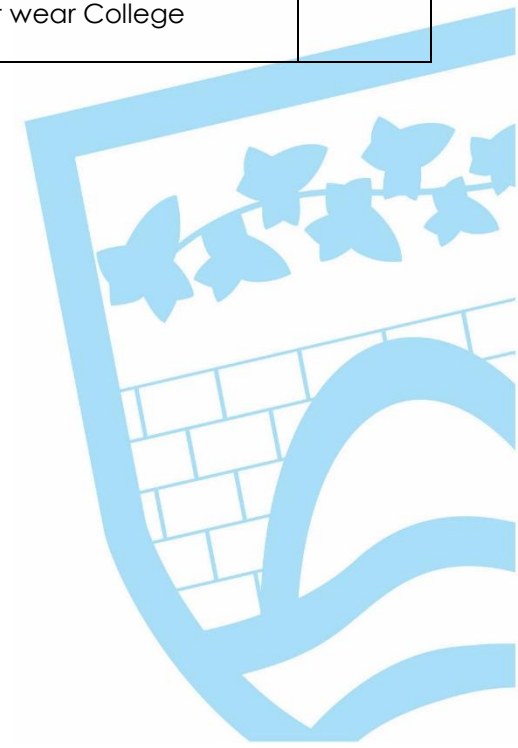

<p><b>Option 6</b> Careers and Work Experience</p>	<p>9.10am – 3.10pm <b>Meet in N1.01</b></p>	<p>The Year 10 Careers Day is aimed at the exploration of potential careers opportunities for the future. There are many benefits to having a career rather than just a job for the money. First it will inspire you to do and be more than your job, in turn this will engage and motivate you further and so, it will be a fulfilling part of your everyday life. In terms of the plans for the day, here is a brief outline: To begin with we will look at some lateral thinking to help us think more creatively and open ourselves up to ideas that we have never considered. We will look at CV and letter of application writing alongside investigating the different types of career options. Finally, we will explore the types of clothing that should be worn for interviews and in the workplace and have time to design some outfits and share the reasons for the selections we have made with the rest of the group.</p>	<p><b>£0</b></p>
<p><b>Option 7</b> First Aid Course</p>	<p>9.10am – 3.10pm <b>Meet in G1.01</b> <b>12 places available</b></p>	<p>The First Aid Course is only for 12 students. The qualification is an Appointed Persons First Aid Course. The Appointed Person course is ideal for any student who wants to be equipped to deal with a medical emergency. First Aid is about empowering people and making them a responsible member of any community/organisation. This course is taught under the guidelines of the HSE First Aid at Work Regulations 1981 and subsequent 2017 changes and is fully endorsed by the UK and European Resuscitation Council Guidelines 2021 as per the HSE requirements.</p>	<p><b>£15</b></p>
<p><b>Option 8</b> French Coursework Day</p>	<p>9.10am – 3.10pm <b>Meet in D2.04</b></p>	<p>Students will be given the opportunity to walk through their French Speaking which forms 25% of their MFL qualification. They will spend the morning looking at role plays, photo cards and general conversation preparation. In the afternoon students will get the opportunity to do a 1-1 walk through of the Speaking examination as well as activities to support reading and listening skills. College uniform or PE kit must be worn.</p>	<p><b>£0</b></p>
<p><b>Option 9</b> Spanish Coursework Day</p>	<p>9.10am – 3.10pm <b>Meet in M2.07</b></p>	<p>Students will be given the opportunity to walk through their Spanish Speaking which forms 25% of their MFL qualification. They will spend the morning looking at role plays, photo cards and general conversation preparation. In the afternoon students will get the opportunity to do a 1-1 walk through of the Speaking examination as well as activities to support reading and listening skills. College uniform or PE kit must be worn.</p>	<p><b>£0</b></p>
<p><b>Option 10</b> Dance - Duet and Trio Coursework Day</p>	<p>9.10am – 3.10pm <b>Meet in the Gymnasium</b></p>	<p>Students will be given the opportunity to work on their duet or trio Dance coursework for the day. In preparation for their moderation (Monday, 5 July) and improving performances based on teacher feedback from Year 10 assessments. Students will be able to spend the day completing coursework. Teacher support and guidance will be provided throughout. Students will be able to work on the stage and plan their lighting and music. ## Confirmation of Student Requirements

### All students must:

1. Wear their lanyards into College. They are compulsory.
2. Register with Tutors for the morning Registration and then go directly to the room or venue stated in the timetable at 9.10am or 2.10pm.
3. Bring plenty of drinks (and snacks, if needed).
4. Attend break and lunch times, as normal.
5. Select an Enrichment Activity Option using Microsoft Forms and remain in that activity on the Enrichment Day.
6. Off-site activities and the First Aid course must be signed up for and paid for on ParentPay.
7. Only sign up to subjects that are currently being studied if a coursework day is to be attended.
8. Wear mufti clothing to attend **Splashdown, Paignton Zoo, Paintballing and Crealy only (dress appropriately).**
9. Wear College uniform or Ivybridge Community College blue PE kit and trainers for all other **on-site activities.**

**Please note** that any student, from now until Enrichment Week, who does not comply with College standards and expectations will be considered for removal from their Enrichment Activity. Parents will be contacted if this action is required.

### Signing up for the Enrichment Activity

**All parent/carers must sign their child/children up to an option (Enrichment Activity). Please sign up to an option outlined in the Enrichment Timetable by clicking on this [link](#) and make your payment via ParentPay if required.**

A register will be produced for each Enrichment Activity. Students will not be allowed to swap activities on the day. They must remain in their chosen activity. All Tutors will have a confirmation list of students' chosen activities and will share it with the Tutor Group.

### Payment Information for Splashdown, Paignton Zoo, Paintballing, Crealy and First Aid

Booking and payment of an activity must be made using ParentPay. If you have not used it before, please go to [www.parentpay.com](http://www.parentpay.com) and log in to activate your account and use the username and password sent to you by the College.

Once booking is completed and payments are paid, a student's place is automatically secured. Students' details will be extracted from SIMS for off-site trips to include parent contact details, medical information, and allergies. Please ensure you inform the College of any changes in personal details. The act of booking and paying for your child's activity on ParentPay represents consent for them to participate in that chosen activity.

If you would like further information regarding ParentPay or you encounter any complications please do not hesitate to telephone the College and ask to speak to the Finance Team with regards to "ParentPay log in request".
